

Mrs. Lola Hood, Retired Teacher, Dies In Calif.

A native of this county, Mrs. Lola Addington Hood, 72, died July 7 in Los Angeles, Calif.

Daughter of the late J. B. and Mrs. Mary Louise McPherson Addington, she attended the county schools and Woman's College, University of North Carolina, Greensboro.

She taught school in the Union community for several years, before going to Verden, Okla., because of the serious illness of her fiancé, Jess W. Hood. The couple was married November 23, 1914. They moved to Arizona, where they lived until Mr. Hood died March 9, 1915.

Mrs. Hood returned to Oklahoma and again took up teaching. After a tour of California with friends, she was offered a school in Long Beach and taught there three or four years. Later, she transferred to Bakersfield and served as assistant principal until her retirement in 1950.

She was a member of the Union Methodist Church.

Funeral services were held July 9 in Los Angeles.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. W. G. Stewart, of Otto, and two brothers, J. W. Addington, of Franklin, and J. G. Addington, of Joplin, Mo.
