

MRS. V. F. HOOD KILLED IN WRECK

Driver Injured When Car
Plunges 400 Feet To
Cullasaja River

Mrs. V. F. Hood of Gainesville, Ga., was killed instantly and her husband, who was driving the car, received a broken arm and other minor injuries in a wreck on the Franklin-Highlands highway. The accident occurred about 10 miles from Franklin near the Cullasaja Falls.

Ed Guy, state highway patrolman, who investigated the case stated that the car left the highway at a point where there was no guard rail on the highway and that the first plunge of the car after leaving the road was 100 feet. Mrs. Hood was thrown from the auto before the car reached the river, and her body was found about 75 feet from the river.

Mr. Hood, who was taken to Angel hospital and treated for his injuries, stated that he was driving about ten miles per hour as there was extremely poor visibility due to heavy fog and rain, and that the accident occurred before he realized what had happened.

Dr. Ed Angel stated that Mr. Hood would be able to leave the hospital within the next few days.
