

A. T. HURST DROPS DEAD

Rites Held At Liberty
Church; 15 Children
Survive

Albert T. Hurst, 64-year old retired carpenter of the Leatherman community, dropped dead, just after leaving the Agricultural building here, last Saturday afternoon. A doctor was immediately summoned, but Mr. Hurst was dead on his arrival.

Funeral services were held at the Liberty Baptist church, of which he was a member, Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. George A. Cloer officiated, and burial was in the church cemetery.

The six older sons served as pallbearers.

A native of this county, Mr. Hurst was a son of John C. and Mrs. Laura E. Greene Hurst. He was twice married. His first wife was Miss Nellie Raby, whom he married in 1910. Following her death, in 1935 he married Miss Bonnie Wykle, who survives.

Also surviving are 15 children, nine by the first marriage, and six by the second: Dover, of Cleveland, Ohio, Troy and Paul, of Franklin, Route 4, Odell, of Franklin, Arthur and Lewis, of Pontiac, Mich., Mrs. Pearl Gilles, of Franklin, Route 4, Misses Mary Belle and Verna Kate, of Leatherman; and the younger children, Howard, Ruth, John C., Dorothy Lee, Levicia, and Patricia. Also surviving are two brothers, Red T. and Emiliis V., of Gastonia; and one sister, Mrs. Fred Dalton, of Franklin, Route 4; and 15 grandchildren.
