

LAST RITES FOR REV. MR. JACOBS AT SALEM CHURCH

Funeral service for the Rev. Anthony Wayne Jacobs, 79, retired Methodist minister, who died Wednesday night, January 20, at the home of his niece, Mrs. Will Bryson, of the Cullasaja section, was held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon at the Salem Methodist church in the Cullasaja section.

The service was conducted by the Rev. H. C. Freeman, pastor of the Franklin circuit, assisted by the Rev. L. B. Hayes, of Waynesville, presiding elder of the Waynesville district, the Rev. J. L. Teague, of Prentiss, the Rev. O. P. Ader, pastor of the Franklin Methodist church, and the Rev. J. C. Umburger.

For many years, Mr. Jacobs was a missionary to the Cherokee Indians, and was associated with the Salem Methodist church, either as a member or as pastor, since his early boyhood. He was a native of Tennessee, but came to Macon county with his parents as a child. His wife, who was Miss Margaret Gray, of Macon county, before their marriage, died 12 years ago. No children survive.

Surviving are two nieces, Mrs. Gilmer A. Jones, of Franklin, and Mrs. Will Bryson, of the Cullasaja section, and two nephews, Lawrence Weaver, of Weaverville, and J. L. Jacobs, of Atlanta, Ga.
