

ROY JENKINS, SWAIN NATIVE, DIES HERE

Was Farmer Of
Route 3; Rites
Held Wednesday

Roy Jenkins, 72-year-old farmer of Franklin, Route 3, died February 16 at his home after an illness of a year.

Funeral services for Mr Jenkins, who was a native of Swain County, were held the 19th at the Oak Grove Baptist Church by the Rev. Paul Heafner and the Rev. Judson Smith. Burial was in the Riverview Methodist Cemetery.
