

Maconian Dies In Washington

Everett C. Jennings, a native of Macon County, and a son of the late William Tolvin and Mary Keener Jennings, passed away unexpectedly in Renton, Wash., Tuesday afternoon, December 31, 1968. Services were held in the Memory Chapel of Washington Memorial Funeral Home, Seattle Wash., on Saturday, January 4, 1969, at 1:00 p.m., with Rev. Bruce Homfeldt officiating. Interment was in Washington Memorial Park, Seattle, with military rites.

Mr. Jennings was born in the Ellijay Community January 26, 1899 but had lived in the State of Washington about 40 years, where he worked as a painter. He was last here for a visit in July, 1967. He was a veteran of World War I, serving with the U. S. Navy, in the Atlantic and North Sea.
