

MRS. JOHNSON, FORMER MACON TEACHER, DIES

Services Held Wednesday

A former Macon County school teacher, Mrs. Grace Moore Johnson, died Tuesday morning at her home in the Prentiss community after a lingering illness. She was 48.

Funeral services were held yesterday (Wednesday) morning at 11 o'clock at the Union Methodist church, of which she was a member.
