

VICTIM OF AUTO ACCIDENT DIES

Harley N. Keener Succumbs To Injuries Received 3 Weeks Ago

Harley N. Keener, 30, died in Angel Brothers' hospital Friday morning, May 13, from injuries sustained in an automobile accident on the Georgia road about three weeks ago.

Burial was at Walnut Creek cemetery at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon with the Rev. H. C. Freeman, pastor of the Franklin circuit, conducting the services.

Mr. Keener had been foreman on a construction job at Gilbertsville, Mass., until recently, when he returned to his home at Gneiss. He is survived by his widow, formerly Miss Myrtle Fulton; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Keener, and three brothers, Wendell Keener of the United States Marines, stationed at San Francisco; Howard Keener, of Washington, D. C., and Randolph Keener, of Gilbertsville, Mass.

Mr. Keener was one of the best known young men in the county. More than 500 persons attended his funeral.
