

KEENER BURIED AT WALNUT CREEK

**Brothers Act as Pallbearers
—Large Crowd Present—
Steel Casket Furnished by
Company.**

The remains of the late Roy Keener were interred at Walnut Creek Methodist cemetery on February 28. He was killed in a blast near Boston the previous Sunday. Further details of the death can be found in a news article reprinted from a Massachusetts paper. Four brothers of the deceased, Randolph, Harley, Howard and Leon, acted as pallbearers. At the time of his death Roy was foreman on a tunnel job. Harley and Randolph are also foremen of similar work near Calderwood, Tenn., while the father, W. A. Keener, is general foreman on outside work at Calderwood. The male members of the family have been engaged on public works for years and are noted for their ability.

Regardless of bad road conditions a very large crowd assembled to pay a tribute of deserved respect to the departed. The West Construction company who employed the deceased sent three large floral wreaths and also furnished a steel vault and casket. The funeral services were conducted by Revs. Ramey and Jollay.
