

Q.S. Keller Dies March 25

Quinton Sylvester Keller, a retired farmer of Loudon, Tenn., died Thursday, March 25, at 11:30 p.m. at the home of a sister, Mrs. Lary Lavinia Haskett, on Franklin, Route 4 (Sanderstown section). He was 69 and had been in declining health for a number of years.
