

Macon Man's Body Is Found In Mississippi

The body of Don Kimsey, missing for more than three weeks in the Mississippi river, has been found, the U. S. Maritime commission advised his mother, Mrs. Frank Carpenter, Monday.

The 23-year-old maritime sailor was reported lost overboard from the U. S. Steamer Tunis near Cairo, Ill. September 26.

The body will be returned here for funeral services and burial. Arrangements will be under the direction of Bryant Funeral Home.

Mr. Kimsey, a graduate of Franklin High school and a veteran of World War II, was born August 1, 1928. He was a member of the Pleasant Hill Baptist church.

Survivors include his mother; his stepfather, Frank Carpenter, of the Skeedah community; his widow, the former Miss Olga Nicholson, of Cartoogechaye; two sisters, Mrs. Sanford Dills, of Atlanta, Ga., and Mrs. Dillard Nicholson, of Cartoogechaye; one half-sister, Delma Jean Carpenter, of the home; and the maternal grandmother, Mrs. J. C. Sanders, of the Skeedah community.
