

Dr. Stuart Frederick Lampe of Atlanta and Clayton died Wednesday, Nov. 8, 2006.

He was born June 7, 1919, in Chicago to Clara L. and Stuart Henry Lampe. He attended St. Petersburg (Fla.) High School and St. Petersburg Junior College. He worked in the civilian shipyard of Chicasaw, Ala., during World War II. He graduated at the top of his class at Emory University's dental school in 1950. He married Marjorie Collins of Atlanta in 1951.

He served in the U.S. Army from 1953-54 in Hiedleburg, Germany, and as first lieutenant in charge of the dental clinic for Phillips Barracks at Karlshue, Germany. He received the Army Occupational Medical and National Defense Service Medal. He practiced dentistry in Atlanta and Smyrna from 1951-86. He spent his retirement years traveling and living in Kona, Hawaii and Lake Burton. He enjoyed woodworking and building furniture. He attended Rocky Grove Baptist Church in Tiger and Hope Chapel in Kona, Hawaii.

Survivors include: his wife, Marjorie Collins Lampe; a son, Stuart Andru Lampe of Roswell; two daughters and sons-in-law, Sherry and John Mather of Naples, Fla., and Bonnie and Rick Owings of Marietta; a brother, Russell Lampe of St. Petersburg, Fla.; and six grandchildren, Lauren and Douglas Barrincau, Sally, Taylor and Davis Owings and Reid McGowan.
