Constance "Connie" Lang, 75, of St. Petersburg, Fla., and formerly of Franklin, passed away Monday, Jan. 23, 2006, at Westminster Suncoast, St. Petersburg.

She was born in Wheelersburg, Ohio, and with her family moved to St. Petersburg in 1942. She attended Mirror Lake Junior High and St. Petersburg High School, graduating in 1948. She graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education with the Charter Class at the University of South Florida in 1963 and received her master's degree with honors from University of South Florida in 1969, majoring in reading and language arts.
