

Isaac Duck Leatherman, a retired farmer of the Cowee community and a Macon County native, died Tuesday, December 7, at 7:28 p.m. in a local hospital at the age of 78. He had been in declining health for some time.

Funeral services for Mr. Leatherman were conducted the 10th at 2:30 p.m. at the Liberty Baptist Church, of which he was a member. Officiating were the Rev. C. C. Welch, the Rev. Joe Bishop, the Rev. Wesley Hopper, and the Rev. Alvin Dendy. Burial was in the Shepard cemetery with Claude Leatherman, T. M. Rickman, Kermie Rogers, C. A. Beasley, Oscar Henry, and Tom Allen serving as pallbearers.

Born Oct. 1, 1887, he was the son of the late Zackie and Mrs. Palestine Gibson Leatherman. Mr. Leatherman was married June 10, 1917 to Mrs. Mattie Mae Buchanan, of Jackson County, who survives.

Leatherman, who is with the U.S. Army in Germany, and Roger Leatherman, of the home; three daughters, Mrs. Leah Hall, of Franklin, Route 4; Mrs. Anthony Munafé, of Wyandotte, Mich.; and Mrs. Robert Dunn, of Battle Creek, Mich.; a sister, Mrs. Margaret Ann Ammons, of Franklin, Route 5; 18 grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.
