

Death Claims Mrs. Ledford At Age Of 90

Mrs. Annie Olivia Ledford, 90, died at her home in the Coweta community Wednesday afternoon at 5 o'clock, following a serious illness of two weeks.

Born Nov. 7, 1856, Mrs. Ledford, the former Miss Annie Olivia Allen, had lived through four wars—the Civil, Spanish American, and two World wars. She had seen the railroad come to Macon County, and had witnessed the succession of the saddlebag era by the horse and buggy days, and the latter period by the automobile and good roads.

She had been a life-long resident of this county and was a member of the Asbury Methodist church. She was married to Bill Ledford, of this county, who survives.

Funeral services were held at the Asbury Methodist church at Otto, on Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock with the Rev. V. N. Allen, pastor, officiating. Interment followed in the church cemetery.

Surviving, in addition to her husband, are three children, Charles Ledford, of Otto, Mrs. Martha Shope, of Coweta, and Mrs. Mary Cabe, of the Otto community; 17 grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.
