William Arthur Lockwood, 81, a longtime resident of Franklin, died at his winter home in Stuart, Fla., on March 16.

He is survived by his wife, Myrtle, of Franklin and Stuart; daughters Marilyn of Howell, Mich., Priscilla of Stuart, Fla., Judy of Pleasant Hill, Calif.; seven grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

Born in Howell, Mich., he was a longtime resident there until the family moved to Lake Worth, Fla. in 1955, where he was a stockbroker for 20 years. A veteran of World War II, he served for three years in the Signal Corps. in Australia and New Guinea.

Mr. Lockwood and his wife were founding and charter members of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Macon County and life and patron members of the Mountain Retreat and Learning Center in Highlands. He was an active

member in both organizations and served on the board of trustees, and was treasurer of the U. U. Fellowship. He also was a long time member of "The Entertainers," a local dance band offering music of the "Big Band Era."
