

**Pfc. George Martin; Cpl.  
Harold F. Sloan, Jr.,  
Killed In Action**

Pfc. George T. Martin, son of Mrs. J. L. Martin, of Franklin route 1, who was reported to be missing in action on August 30, in France, was later reported by the War Department to have been killed in action on the same date.

Pfc. Martin, who entered the armed forces in 1943, took his basic training at Camp Croft, S. C., and at Ft. George Meade, Md., and was sent overseas this summer, arriving in England in June. He was serving with the infantry unit.

Pfc. Martin is a graduate of the Franklin high school, and was home on a 14-day furlough in May of this year. He was a son of the late Rev. J. L. Martin.

Surviving besides the mother, are one brother, Frank J. Martin, of Akron, Ohio; and five sisters, Mrs. William Dalrymple, of Franklin route 1, Mrs. Daniel Baker, of Fort Myers, Fla., Mrs. Winifred Brendle, of Drexel, Miss Eula Martin, of Drexel, and Miss Dorothy Martin, of Franklin route 1.
