

## EARLY MASHBURN WRECK VICTIM

**Fred Blaine and Newton  
Cunningham Seriously In-  
jured When Car Goes  
Into Railroad Cut Near  
State Line.**

Early Mashburn is dead and Fred Blaine and Newton Cunningham are seriously injured as a result of an automobile wreck that occurred about 10:00 o'clock Monday night on the Georgia road a short distance north of the State line. The three are said to have been going in the direction of Georgia. While rounding the last curve before reaching the state line the car left the road and ran for a hundred yards along the fill and finally plunged through the woods and over the railroad cut, a sheer drop of forty feet, and landed on the cross ties. The car was a complete wreck. About daylight Tuesday morning Blaine made his way to the home of Sam Corn who notified the sheriff's office. Sheriff Ingram immediately proceeded to the scene and found Mashburn dead beside the completely wrecked car. Cunningham was still in the machine. Both Blaine and Cunningham were brought to a local hospital. According to reports both have a chance of recovery. Blaine is a resident of Franklin as was also Mashburn, a former citizen, now resides in Akron, Ohio. The car is said to belong to Cunningham who is believed to have been driving at the time of the wreck.
