

M'CALL DIES IN HOSPITAL

Graveside Rites For Macon Native Held At Long Branch

Lyman McCall, 49, a Macon native who has been in a Raleigh hospital for the past 15 years, died of pneumonia January 19.

Graveside rites for Mr. McCall, who was a farmer and member of the Goldmine Baptist Church, were held at the Long Branch Cemetery by the Rev. John H. Baly Sunday at 2:30 p.m.

Born November 18, 1905, he was the son of David A. McCall and the late Mrs. Rose McClure McCall, of the Gneiss community.

In addition to his father he is survived by three brothers, Sam and Edgar, of Gneiss, and Elmer McCall, of Daytona Beach, Fla., and a number of nieces and nephews.
