

FUNERAL HELD

Former County Commissioner Dies After Long Illness

Charles H. McClure, 68, died at his home on Franklin Route 2, Sunday at 12:45 p. m., after an illness of several months. Direct cause of his death was attributed to heart disease.

Funeral services were held at the home Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock with the Rev. J. A. Flanagan in charge. Interment was in the Rush cemetery on the Georgia road.

Mr. McClure was born and reared in Macon county and spent his entire life here, except for about 12 years when he lived in the state of Washington.
