

A. D. McKinney

Dies Of Heart Attack In Alabama

News of the death of Allison Dickerson McKinney, who passed away suddenly in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, July 7, came as a shock to members of his family and friends here. Mr. McKinney was a railway conductor and suffered a heart attack as he entered the hotel lobby in Tuscaloosa following the day's run. Funeral services conducted at the Brown-Norwood Chapel in Birmingham, his home city, Friday afternoon with military honors, and interment was in Forest Hill cemetery.

Mr. McKinney was in his 65th year. The eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. P. McKinney, he held the distinction of being the first white child born in Highlands. He was a member of the Presbyterian church, a Spanish War veteran, a charter member of the Bendale Masonic Lodge in Birmingham, and a member of the Order of Railway Conductors. At the last meeting of the Spanish War veterans, Mr. McKinney was elected as a delegate to attend their annual convention to be held in Boston in August.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Ada Taylor McKinney, one son, Carl T. McKinney, of Jackson.
