

Mr. Meadows

Zeb Meadows, 76, of Franklin, died Friday, Nov. 27, in a local hospital.

A native of Macon County, he was the son of the late Crude Meadows and Kate Cansler Meadows. He attended Brevard College and the University of South Carolina. He served a distinguished career in the Navy, serving in W.W. II and the Korean Conflict. After leaving the military he became Franklin's postmaster after being recommended to President Truman by Rep. Monroe M. Redden; he retired in 1981 after 31 years of service. He had served terms as VFW Post 7339 and District 17 commander, and served 33 consecutive years as quartermaster for the Franklin post, during which time the post quadrupled its membership, growing from 162 members to 617. He was a faithful member of the VFW Post 7339 and American Legion Post 108 funeral detail and was a member of the First Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife of 36 years, Meda Angel Meadows; a daughter, Elizabeth Meadows Crabtree of Mableton, Ga.; a son, William Zeb Meadows of Lawrenceville, Ga.; two sisters, Lillie Myers of Franklin and Catherine Rogers of New London; three grandchildren, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Sunday, Nov. 29, in the chapel of Macon Funeral Home, with Rev. Thomas Griffis officiating. Burial was in Iotla Methodist Church Cemetery, with military graveside rites conducted by

VFW Post 7339 and American Legion Post 108.

Members of VFW Post 7339 and American Legion Post 108 served as pallbearers.
