Col. Larry J. Michael, 65, of Otto, died Thursday, March 8, in Asheville.

He served with the U.S. Marines during the Korean War, and served 23 years as a police officer in New York state. In addition, he was an auctioneer, an antique dealer and a published author in a number of antique reference books. For many years, he operated Daze of Yore Antiques, both in Chautauga, N.Y., and Otto.
