

# SERVICES FOR MORRISON

Former West's Mill  
Postmaster Passes  
At 75 In Hospital

Funeral services for Harley Ray Morrison, 75, who died October 25 at Angel Hospital following a serious illness of 10 days, were conducted Friday at 2:30 p. m. at the Cowee Baptist Church, of which he was a member.

Officiating were the Rev. C. C. Welch, the Rev. N. E. Holden, and the Rev. George Cloer. Burial was in the Oak Grove Cemetery.

A merchant, Mr. Morrison was postmaster at West's Mill for 26 years. He retired five years ago. He was a member of Junior Order of United American Mechanics.

Born August 3, 1880, Mr. Morrison was the son of William H. and Mrs. Martha J. Bradley Morrison, of the Oak Grove section. He was twice married. His first wife, who died in 1927, was Miss Anna Janick, of South Dakota. In 1934 he was married to Miss Minnie Potts, of the Cowee community, who survives.
