

James M. Morrison Final Rites Sunday

Funeral services for James M. Morrison, 75, prominent farmer of the Oak Grove community, were held Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the Oak Grove Baptist church. The Rev. Robert W. Williams, pastor, officiated, assisted by the Rev. Norman E. Holden, of Leatherman, the Rev. George A. Cloer, of Franklin Route 4, and the Rev. W. L. Bradley, of Oak Grove community. Interment was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Morrison died at his home Saturday evening about 8:45 o'clock following an illness of more than eight months.

A well-known citizen, and a life-long resident of Macon county, Mr. Morrison was born on February 6, 1866. He was the son of the late Joseph and Margaret Bryson Morrison. On October 13, 1892, he was married to Miss Margaret Ann Meadows, of the Oak Grove community. To their union were born nine children, three of whom survive.
