

Clyde Edmond Moses, 91, of Franklin, passed away Sunday, Sept. 17, 2006.

A native of Jackson County, he was the son of the late William Moses and Fannie Keener Moses. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by brothers Charlie, Arthur, Pete, Claude, Adam, Howard and Willie; and sisters Mary and Clara.
