

FORMER MACON RESIDENT DIES IN ASHEVILLE

Services For G. B. Myers
Held Here Tuesday
Afternoon

A former Macon County resident, George B. Myers, died Sunday morning in an Asheville hospital after a lengthy illness at the age of 71.

Services were held here Tuesday at 3 p. m. at the home of his niece, Mrs. A. G. Cagle. Officiating was the Rev. C. E. Murray, pastor of the Franklin Methodist church. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.

Mr. Myers, who resided in Douglas, Ore., for a number of years before returning to Asheville two years ago, was cited during World War II by President Roosevelt for his work in buying and selling war bonds. In Douglas he was postmaster at one time, a cattle and sheep rancher, and was interested in the oil business. Also he was a 32nd degree Mason.

Survivors include four brothers, Floyd and Bill Myers, of Asheville, Jess Myers, of Portland, Ore., and Lawrence Myers, of Franklin; five sisters, Mrs. Mary Pattillo, of Hendersonville, Mrs. Norman Saunders, of Candler, Mrs. Bertha Marfatt, of Baker, Ore.; and Mrs. Brab Angel and Mrs. David Jacobs, of Franklin.

Active pallbearers were Ed Duval, George Conley, Harry Higgins, Perry Bradley, W. H. Cabe, and W. T. Moore.

Honorary pallbearers were members of the Masonic lodge.
