

## L. H. Page Dies Aboard Ship In Japanese Port

L. H. Page, vice-president of Franklin Mineral Products Company, died suddenly November 3, it has been learned here.

Mr. and Mrs. Page and the latter's sister, Mrs. John Davenport, were on a round-the-world cruise, and Mrs. Page cabled C. W. Clark, manager of the Mineral Products concern, from Japan. It is understood Mr. Page died aboard ship, while the ship was in a Japanese port. The three left New York in late September.

Mr. Page, 65, came to Franklin in the 20's, shortly after the Mineral Products company was organized. He and Mrs. Page had a home on Rogers hill, where they lived for a number of years. About two years ago, when his health began to fall, they moved to Boston.

During his residence here, Mr. Page was a member of the Franklin Rotary Club for several years.

Survivors, in addition to his widow, include one daughter, Mrs. Paul Jackson, of Fulton, Mo., and a sister, who makes her home in Wisconsin.

No information had been received here yesterday after the funeral.
