

## Ex-Slave

### Dies Near West's Mill Last Friday

Aunt Lucinda Beck Parrish, colored, died at the home of her daughter in Cowee township, near West's Mill on last Friday, February 16. Death resulted from injuries received in a fall on February 8.

"Aunt Cindy," as she was called, was born in Rabun county, Ga., on March 10, 1845, and was nearly 95 years of age. She was a slave of Col. Samuel Beck, who lived on the Walhalla road 12 miles south of Clayton.

About 1876 or 1877 she moved to Macon county where she spent the rest of her life.

"Aunt Cindy" was held in high regard by all who knew her, both black and white. She was a devoted member of Pine Grove Baptist church.

Funeral services were conducted at the home by Rev. E. S. Wiley, of Franklin, assisted by Rev. E. G. Siler, of Iota. Burial was in the family cemetery.

She was the mother of eight children, five sons and three daughters, and is survived by 35 grandchildren, 43 great-grandchildren and 26 great-great-grandchildren.
