

MRS. PATTON'S FUNERAL HELD

Wife of Former Senator
Dies after Long
Illness

Funeral services for Mrs. Robert A. Patton, who died at her home in Patton valley at 11:45 o'clock Friday morning after a severe illness of several months, were held at 11 o'clock Saturday morning at the Patton Methodist church.

Mrs. Patton, wife of former State Senator Robert A. Patton, had been in ill health for a number of months. During the winter her condition became serious and she was taken to an Asheville hospital for treatment. Little hope for her recovery was seen by physicians and she was brought back to her home in Macon county.

A woman of outstanding character, ability and charm, Mrs. Patton was one of the most prominent and best beloved women in the county.

Surviving Mrs. Patton, besides her husband, are seven children, Charles Robert, Helen, James, George, Mack and Andy Jack; and two brothers, Sheriff A. B. Slagle, of Franklin, and Carl Slagle, of Cartoogechaye.

Mrs. Patton was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Slagle. She was married to Robert A. Patton in November, 1913. She was a graduate of Davenport college.

The Rev. J. B. Tabor, pastor of the Macon Methodist circuit, conducted the funeral, assisted by the Rev. C. C. Herbert, Jr., pastor of the Franklin Methodist church.
