

Fall Is Fatal

To Floyd Pendergrass, Kyle Resident

Floyd Pendergrass, 44, of the Kyle community, is dead as the result of a fall while fishing.

Mr. Pendergrass was able to walk the distance of a mile and a half from the lake to his home, but became paralyzed soon after reaching home. He told members of his family that he had fallen while fishing and struck his head upon a rock.

When he became paralyzed, he was taken to a hospital in Andrews, where he died at 4 p. m. Saturday.

Survivors include his widow, the former Miss Etta Willis; two daughters, Mary Belle and Julia; three sons, Hubert, Howard, and Charles; his father, John Pendergrass, of Kyle; five sisters, Mrs. Hamilton Adams, of Roster, Ga., Mrs. Lyle Baldwin, of Kyle, Mrs. Sherlin Evans, of Aquone, Mrs. Lawrence Cochran, of Franklin, Route 3, and Mrs. Jim Grant, of Ellijay, Ga.; and seven brothers, William, Wesley, and Jeff Pendergrass, of Kyle, Harley and Alex, of Franklin, Route 1, and Willey and Troy, of Franklin, Route 3.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Kyle Baptist church, with the Rev. R. D. Denny officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery.
