G. A. Pendergrass, Of Nantahala, Dies

George Alexander Pendergrass, a native of this county and resident of the Nantahala section, died Saturday, November 16, at 7:45 a.m. at his home. A farmer, he was 84 and had been in declining health for some time.

Funeral services for Mr. Pendergrass were conducted the 17th at 2 p.m., at the White Oaks Flats Baptist Church, of which he was a member, by the Rev. S. J. Waters and the Rev. T. D. Denny. Burial was in the Aquone Baptist Church cemetery. Pallbearers were Frank Hamby, Ray Morgan, Ben Cope, Don Owenby, and Howard and Hubert Pendergrass.

Born May 28, 1879, he was the son of John A. and Mrs. Nannde Dills Pendergrass. He was married to Miss Sarah Cope, of Jackson County, who died in 1946.

Surviving are a son, Claude Pendergrass, of Nantahala; a daughter, Miss May Pendergrass, of the home; a brother, Miles Pendergrass, of Nantahala; and a sister, Mrs. Agnes Morgan, also of Nantahala.
