

Penland Succumbs At Home

Farmer Was 77;
Services Held
At Mt. Zion

John Burton Penland, farmer of the Cartoogechaye community (Wayah Valley), died August 14 at 1:30 p.m. at his home. Seventy-seven, he had been ill for 18 months.

Funeral services for Mr. Penland, a native of Hiwassee, Ga., were conducted the 16th at the Mt. Zion Methodist Church, of which he was a member. Officiating were the Rev. J. C. Lane, pastor, the Rev. J. R. Willis, and the Rev. Sim Martin, of Young Harris, Ga.

Mr. Penland and his wife, the former Miss Mary Jane Johnson, of Hayesville, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary Dec. 16, 1956. Mr. Penland had farmed here for 16 years.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, Von, of Eaton, Colo., and Wayne, of Franklin, Route 1; four daughters, Mrs. R. P.
