

OLDEST MEMBER BAPTIST CHURCH FUNERAL RITES

Mrs. Sarah Susan Potts, 88, died at her home in East Franklin, Sunday morning, October 9, following a long illness.

Funeral services were held last Wednesday afternoon at the Franklin Baptist church with the Rev. James F. Marchman, the Rev. W. N. Cook, and the Rev. Bill Sorrells conducting the service. Burial services followed in the Franklin cemetery.
