

W. H. POTTS DIES TUESDAY

Retired Merchant
Passes At Nephew's;
Rites In Franklin

William Henley Potts, a Macon native and retired merchant, died Tuesday at 11 a.m. at the home of his nephew, George W. Reece, in Franklin.

Eighty-five years old, Mr. Potts had been ill only a short time. A member of the Franklin Methodist Church, he ran a store on Cartoogechaye and Prentiss for some 30 years before retiring. He had lived with Mr. Reece for the past nine years.

Funeral services were conducted yesterday (Wednesday) at 2:30 p.m. at the Franklin Methodist Church by the pastor, the Rev. S. B. Moss. Burial was in the Mt. Zion Cemetery.

Born November 16, 1869, Mr. Potts was the son of Washington and Mrs. Caroline Addington Potts, of the Potts Branch section of the Patton community.

He is survived by a number of nieces and nephews.
